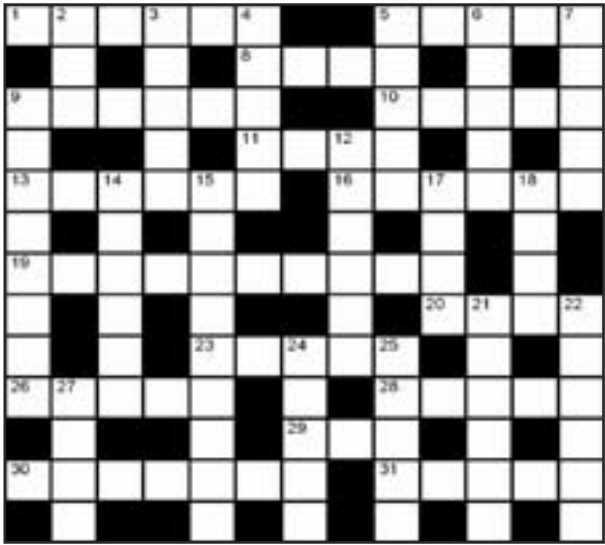

Clean up message having an impact



Clean up Australia Day began a day early on Saturday the 28th of February for a dedicated group from Longford and Westbury angling clubs heading to Brushy Lagoon, keen to clean up the shorelines and surrounds of their favourite fishing location. These clubs have been working closely with the Inland Fisheries Service, Forestry Tasmania, Anglers Alliance and the Devonport Fishing Club, where a partnership has been created with the aim of adopting this water in an effort to improve infrastructure in the area. The first step is to host annual clean up days, as a way of managing rubbish issues and to highlight the need to look after our recreational areas so all members of the public can access and enjoy them. Three years ago this water was almost closed to the public due to vandalism and neglect. Longford Fishing Club secretary Janet Lambert said that clubs involved in the management group are keen to see the area developed back to its full potential as a major recreational fishery. To help promote this water, last year saw the running of the inaugural

Brushy Lagoon Fishing Competition, with 120 competitors vying for a variety of prizes. The current aim is to build upon this annual event, which can only happen if the public continues to respect the area by adhering to the take your rubbish home message. We were delighted to see that the message is starting to have a positive effect as this year has seen a huge reduction in the amount of rubbish collected. We are working towards improved boat ramps, car parking, disabled fishing platforms, picnic tables and BBQ areas, making Brushy Lagoon attractive to the general public as an area they can enjoy with their families close to home.
